You will be asked to **show government issued photo ID** when checking in at the Plant Security.
All tour guests must wear **long pants, closed toe and closed heel shoes**. Open toe or open back shoes and shorts are not allowed in the plant.

Arrival by car: Please enter at Gate 2, and park in Visitors Parking. Proceed to the Gate 2 Guard House where Security will confirm your reservation and a Visitor's Centre staff member will come to greet you.

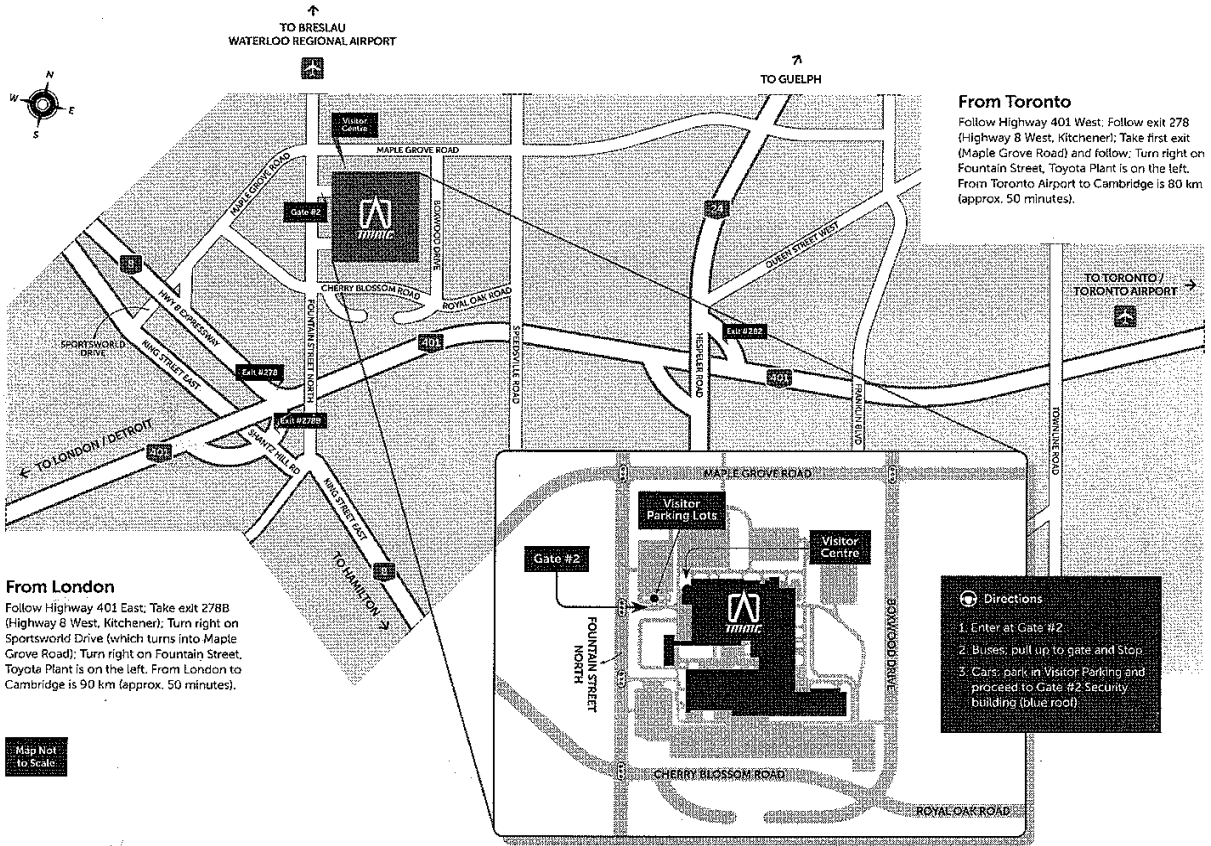
Tour Rules:

Toyota Motor Manufacturing Canada is an active manufacturing facility. As a result, the safety of all those who enter the plant is our first priority. Along the tour, the trams will enter the Welding Shop, where welding sparks are present. While these sparks are not harmful, some fabrics are more easily flammable. Please refer to the following tour rules for your safety and enjoyment of our plant tour experience:

- Only natural fibres may be worn in the plant (wool, cotton, silk, linen, etc.)
 - No Acrylic, Polyester, Rayon, Synthetic fibre (microfibre) clothing can be worn while on tour.
 - No shorts, skirts, tear-away pants, nylon pants or nylon tops. *Cotton smocks will be provided if necessary.*
 - No hats or scarves can be worn while on tour.
 - No open sandals or high-heeled shoes.
 - No cameras, cell phones, pagers or other communication devices.
 - No MP3 or other music players or any type of personal headphone device can be worn during the visit.
 - No purses, bags, or knapsacks - *these items will be stored under lock and key in the Visitor Centre while on tour.*
 - Mobility assist devices that are needed to transport guests to the tram will be left in a safe, but unattended, location. TMMC is not responsible for any lost or damaged items.
 - No food or drinks allowed during the tour.
 - Arms and legs must be kept inside the tram at all times.
 - Safety glasses must be worn at all times – these will be provided.
 - Each guest must wear an audio headset during the tour.
 - Children must be at least 8 years of age, and must be accompanied by an adult.
 - Visitors who are under the influence of alcohol or drugs are not allowed to enter the facility.
 - Smoking is not permitted on site.

Follow Highway 401 East; Take exit 278B (Highway 8 West, Kitchener). Turn right on Sportsworld Drive (which turns into Maple Grove Road); Turn right on Fountain Street; Toyota Plant is on the left. From London to Cambridge is 90 km (approx. 50 minutes).

From Toronto
Follow Highway 401 West; Follow exit 278 (Highway 8 West, Kitchener); Take first exit (Maple Grove Road) and follow; Turn right on Fountain Street; Toyota Plant is on the left. From Toronto Airport to Cambridge is 80 km (approx. 50 minutes).
